<p>02 – Reasons for Study Essay</p>	<p>(02) Reasons for Study Essay.pdf The Reasons for Study Essay should answer the following two questions and should be written in the Japanese or English.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◇ Why did you choose to apply for a study abroad program at KGU? (300 words) ◇ What do you plan on doing after your study abroad program and what kind of impact will it have on this plan? (300 words)
<p>03 – Self-Report of Medical Condition</p>	<p>Self Report of Medical Conditions Online Form Fill out the Self-Report of Medical Conditions Online Form and receive a PDF via email after online submission.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ※ The information included in this document will serve as a quick reference should any medical emergencies arise while you are participating in the program. It is important that you submit accurate information regarding your medical history. All students must submit this document. ※ Applicants hoping to receive special academic support during their time at KGU should also submit a letter of accommodation describing in details the kind of support they receive in their home institution.
<p>04 – Certificate of Health</p>	<p>(04) Certificate of Health Print out the "(03) Self-Report of Medical Condition PDF" and the "(04) Certificate of Health" form and have it filled out by your principal physician within 6 months prior to the date of application.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ※ The X-ray examination is <u>omissible</u> for students who are currently living in a Tuberculosis Low Burden <u>Country</u>, defined as a country where the "Total TB Incidence Rate" is lower than 10 (refer to WHO TB Country Profile for details about your current country of residence). If that is your case, please make sure that your physician indicate why you have not undertaken the X-ray examination when they fill out the Certificate of Health. ※ Ensure that in addition to the medical data, the principal physician also <u>answers the final question</u>, "In the view of this individual's history and the above findings, is it your observafion that his or her health status is adequate for life in Japan". If they do not answer this question, we cannot accept the certificate.





<p>05 – Recommendation Letter</p>	<p>Recommendation Letter Upload Form</p> <p>Ask a professor or academic advisor to write a Recommendation Letter.</p> <p>The letter should include the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◇ The applicant’s name, the professor’s or academic advisor’s name, signature and contact details. ◇ A paragraph or sentence that explains the relationship between the writer and the applicant and the duration of said relationship. ◇ A (short) narrative addressing the applicant's motivation for learning, general attitude, goals and plans as an exchange student. <p>The letter should be signed and dated.</p> <p>Please provide this link to the person who will fill out the form along with your application number so they can submit the letter.</p>
<p>06 – Japanese Language Assessment Form <i>*if applicable</i></p>	<p>Japanese Language Assessment Form</p> <p>For students who are currently or have in the past studied Japanese in an academic settings (university or language schools). Please provide this link to the person who will fill out the form along with your application number.</p> <p>※ If you currently do not have a Japanese instructor, but need a teacher to evaluate your Japanese level, please try your best to find a teacher from a legitimate institution and ask them to interview you to fill it out.</p>
<p>07 – Official Grade Transcript</p>	<p>Please submit your <u>LATEST full academic record</u> from the time you entered an establishment of higher education to now.</p> <p>※ The document should include both grades and grading scale.</p>
<p>08 – Scan of Passport</p>	<p>The scan should fill the following specifications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◇ Only the full ID page of the passport is required. ◇ The scan must not be blurry. ◇ The scan must be fully captured. Cut off scans will be rejected. <p>※ Passports must be valid beyond the date of your return after the exchange program finishes. If your passport is currently invalid or expiring during your exchange program, turn in a scan of the expired/current passport and apply for a new passport immediately.</p>
<p>09 – Digital ID photograph</p>	<p>The digital ID photograph must follow the below requirements.</p> <p>(09) Digital ID Photo Requirements.pdf</p> <p>This Youtube Video should also give you some idea of what is expected.</p> <p> 7 things to keep in mind to submit a perfect digital ID photo</p>
<p>10 – Statement of Finance</p>	<p>(10) About Statement of Finance.pdf</p> <p>Read the instructions in the PDF above, create your Statement of Finance as indicated and receive a PDF via email after online submission.</p>



<p>I 1 – KGU Immigration Application Form</p>	<p><i>Applicants holding a Japanese passport are exempt from submitting this document.</i></p> <p>KGU Immigration Application Form</p> <p>Fill out the KGU Immigration Application Form receive a PDF via email after online submission.</p> <p>Information provided in this online form will be used to submit an application for your Certification Of Eligibility to the Japan Immigration Bureau.</p>
<p>I 2 – Copy of JLPT Certificate *if applicable</p>	<p>In order to take regular university courses, an extremely high level of Japanese ability is required. Students who can submit proof of having passed JLPT (Japanese Language Proficiency Test) N1 before arriving in Japan, or who pass the Regular Course Aptitude Test (JLPT N1 equivalent level) at KGU after arriving in Japan, will be able to enroll in regular university courses held in Japanese.</p>
<p>I 3 – KGU Sponsored Scholarship Application Essay *if applicable</p>	<p>(I 3) KGU Sponsored Scholarship Application Essay.pdf</p> <p>This 800 words essay should be one (1) A4 page typed and must be written by the student. This essay can be written in Japanese or in English. It should answer the following questions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◇ Why do you need financial assistance? ◇ How will getting a scholarship impact your study abroad experience? <p>※ This essay is different from "(02) Reasons for Study Essay" above and is only required from students applying for a scholarship.</p>
<p>I 4 – KGU Sponsored Scholarship Application Form *if applicable</p>	<p>(I 4) Scholarship Application Guide.pdf (I 4) KGU Sponsored Scholarship Application Form.xlsx</p> <p>Students should read the "Scholarship Application Guide" carefully before asking their exchange coordinator to fill this form. Details about eligibility and Scholarship GPA Formula are included in the guide.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ※ This form must be filled by your exchange coordinator or authorized person at your university. ※ Students applying through the University Studies Abroad Consortium (USAC), the Association of Christian Universities and Colleges in Asia (ACUCA) are not eligible to apply for these scholarships.
